<u>Purpose</u> The Local Public Prosecutors and Public Defenders Training Fund was established to deposit specified penalty assessments for the purpose of providing funding for statewide programs of education, training, and research for local public prosecutors and public defenders.		
<u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> California Emergency Management Agency/Org 0690		
<u>Major Revenue Source</u> Penalty assessments for specified offenses, pursuant to Section 1464 of the Penal Code.		
<u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code 16346, in the absence of language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> The money in this fund may be expended for the purposes specified, upon appropriation by the Legislature.		
<u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Always Excluded - The major revenue source is transferred from another fund, which has already been counted in an included or always excluded fund, the Assessment Fund, and should not be double counted.		
<u>Comments/Historical Information</u> Chapter 40, Statutes of 1986 created the Local Public Prosecutors and Public Defenders Training Fund. Chapter 530, Statutes of 1980 created Penal Code, section 1464. OCJP is abolished as of 1/1/04, per Chapter 157, Statutes of 2003. OCJP’s public safety programs, with the exception of its juvenile justice programs, which were transferred to the Board of Corrections, have been transferred to OES/0690. Per Chapter 372, Statutes of 2008, the Office of Emergency Services and the Office of Homeland Security are merged to form the California Emergency Management Agency.
