<u>Purpose</u> The Traumatic Brain Injury Fund was established to deposit specified fines and penalties for the purpose of funding an array of services for adults 18 years of age and older with acquired traumatic brain injury, including supported living, community reintegration, and vocational supportive services; and developing leveraged use of the funds.		
<u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Department of Rehabilitation/Org 5160		
<u>Major Revenue Source</u> Fines and penalties for specified offenses, pursuant to Section 1464 of the Penal Code.		
<u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code 16346, in the absence of language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> The money in this fund may be expended for the purposes specified, upon appropriation by the Legislature.		
<u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Always Excluded -Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from penalties.		
<u>Comments/Historical Information</u> Chapter 439, Statutes of 2009 (AB 398) changed the administering organization from the Department of Mental Health/Org 4440 to the Department of Rehabilitation/Org 5160. This chapter also extended the repeal date for these provisions from July 1, 2012 until July 1, 2019; and deleted references to the program as a demonstration project. In addition, this chapter amended Section 4358.5 to allow funds deposited in the Traumatic Brain Injury Fund, pursuant to paragraph 8 of subdivision (f) of Section 1464 of the Penal Code, to be matched by federal vocational rehabilitation services funds for implementation of the Traumatic Brain Injury program pursuant to the chapter.
