As a result, the name of the Sanitarian Registration Fund was changed to the Registered Environmental Health Specialist Fund.<br>Chapter 415, Statutes of 1995 repealed Health and Safety Code section 527 and moved the fund to Health and Safety Code section 106700.<br>Original Administrative Organization Code 4260 was changed to 4265 due to the Department of Health Services splitting into two departments effective July 2007 according to Chapter 241, Statutes of 2006 (SB162). |  |  |
