<u>Legal Citation/Authority</u> Chapter 144, Statutes of 2000; amended by Chapter 912, Statutes of 2000 Health and Safety Code section 25395.20

<u>Purpose</u> To establish an urban cleanup program to clean up and redevelop contaminated properties, known as brownfields.		
<u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Department of Toxic Substances Control/Org 3960		
<u>Major Revenue Source</u> Transfer of \$85,000,000 from the General Fund.		
<u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> Local Assistance funding is continuously appropriated. Funding for State operations is available upon appropriation by the legislature.		
<u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Always Excluded – The major revenue source is transferred from another fund which has already been counted or will be counted in an included fund, (General Fund 0001), and should not be double counted.		
<u>Comments/Historical Information</u> Chapter 912, Statutes of 2000 repealed some provisions of Chapter 144, Statutes of 2000. The appropriation of \$500,000 to the department for costs related to the development of this program for fiscal year 2000/01 was increased by \$2 million for a total of \$2.5 million for fiscal year 2000/01.
