<u>Legal Title</u> Missing Persons DNA Data Base Fund		
<u>Legal Citation/Authority</u> Chapter 822 Statutes of 2000 Penal Code section 14251 (b)		
<u>Fund Classification</u> <u>GAAP Basis</u> Governmental/Special Revenue Funds	<u>Fund Classification</u> <u>Legal Basis</u> Governmental/Other Governmental Cost Funds	
<u>Purpose</u> Establish and maintain laboratory infrastructure, DNA sample storage, DNA analysis, and labor costs for cases of missing persons and identified remains. Up to 5% of the fees collected may be used for administration costs.		
<u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Department of Justice/Org 0820		
<u>Major Revenue Source</u> Fee increase of \$2 for death certificates.		
<u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> No appropriation authority was noted in the legislation. The Budget Act or legislation may establish later appropriation.		
<u>State Appropriations Limit</u>  Excluded – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes, however, when transferred, may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues have a logical, direct relationship with the use or purposes for which they are used.		
<u>Comments/Historical Information</u> Per Chapter 822 Statutes of 2000 created this fund will remain in effect only until January 1, 2006, unless that date is repealed or extended by a later enacted statute. Chapter 471, Statutes of 2005 changed the repeal date to January 1, 2010. Chapter 228, Statutes of 2009 deleted the repeal date.
