<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Fees pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 1797.197a (d) (1).		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, in the absence of language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment, shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> All moneys deposited in the fund shall be made available, upon appropriation, to the authority.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Excluded</b> – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes, however, when transferred, may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues are used to regulate the activities engaged in by the payers.
