<u>Fund Classification</u> <u>GAAP Basis</u> Governmental/Special Revenue Funds		<u>Fund Classification</u> <u>Legal Basis</u> Governmental/Other Governmental Cost Funds
<u>Purpose</u> To implement, operate and enforce the ammunition authorization program in accordance with Penal Code sections 30370 through 30395.		
<u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Department of Justice/0820		
<u>Major Revenue Source</u> A \$25 million loan from the General Fund pursuant to Penal Code section 30371 (a) and ammunition purchase authorization fees.		
<u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, in the absence of language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> Notwithstanding Government Code section 13340, funds are continuously appropriated.		
<u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Excluded – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes; however, when transferred, they may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues are used to regulate the activities engaged in by the payers.		
<u>Comments/Historical Information</u> Proposition 63 – The Safety for All Act of 2016 – was approved by voters on November 8, 2016. October 2018: Establishing Authority changed from Prop 63, Penal Code section 30370 (h). May 2023: Updated the GAAP Basis classification from General Fund to Special Revenue Funds.
