<b><u>Purpose</u></b> Money in the fund will be used by the Department of Fish and Wildlife to pay for all or a portion of its costs related to the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mitigation credit agreement with a person or entity</li> <li>• Proposed strategy or proposed assessment by a public agency or federally recognized tribe</li> </ul>		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Department of Fish and Wildlife/3600		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> In accordance with Fish and Game Code section 1857 (b), the department shall collect fees or other compensation from a person or an entity that proposes to enter into a mitigation credit agreement, and from a public agency or federally recognized tribe that proposes a regional conservation investment strategy or a regional conservation assessment.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent language that identifies a successor fund, any balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Upon appropriation by the Legislature		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Excluded</b> – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes, however, when transferred, may become proceeds of taxes. These revenues have a logical, direct relationship with the use or purposes for which they are used.
